



BOUDICA OF THE CATSKILLS

Q. What has four legs, a really long tail, and is beautiful? A. Me!

My name is Boudica which is pronounced Boo-Dih-Kuh. I was named after a Celtic Queen that once defeated the Romans. My parents call me Boo-Boo. Sometimes they get mixed up and call me Boo-Boo-No.

I was born in North Carolina to Tamara Ritzenthaler, Ierne Irish Wolfhounds. Tamara and her husband, Randy, and her son Sean took good care of me. I lived in North Carolina with my Irish Wolfhound Mom Nora, three other Wolfies Stella, Sorsha, Aiden, and Gordy a Border Terrier. Nora is a really pretty hound, and my father was a really Big Big dog!



My new Mom, Randi, came to visit me in North Carolina. Then a few weeks later she came back and we both flew to La Guardia! I was only 14 weeks old but weighed 44 pounds so I had to fly in cargo. New York is really dog friendly. New Yorkers really like all dogs, but because I am so beautiful, I'm like a star! Everybody tells me how pretty I am, which of course I know, but I still like to hear it. In good weather, there are some restaurants here that allow outside eating with dogs and Mom and Dad are taking me!

I don't like training much. I mean, if I do a command the first time I shouldn't have to do it again should I? You see, I am really smart, so I don't feel I need to do anything more than once.

Mom and Dad told me what a nice club GLIWA is, and how they enjoyed attending some events. Although they live in New York for five years now, they are still GLIWA members. We send good wishes to all GLIWA members, whether two or four footed.

Note from Randi – I was re-reading the Complete Irish Wolfhound Third Edition by Alma Starbuck and one section really hit me and my love for the breed: "How can you have 'dog sense' if you've never had a dog before, or been interested in one, and perhaps are being talked into having this one by a lovable wife or a persuasive husband? Truly, I never worry about these last situations since Wolfhounds are notorious in breaking down all resistance to dog ownership and may who have never wanted a dog find themselves with a Wolfhound and thereafter though the years will never be without one. Forward from the AVMA:

False rumors of new strains of canine distemper virus

It was recently brought to our attention that there are rumors circulating online about the existence of two new strains of canine distemper virus. These rumors are untrue. After consulting with two experts, Dr. Ed Dubovi (from Cornell) and Dr. Ron Schultz (from the University of Wisconsin), we provide the following information:

- There is no data to back up claims that the disease is on the rise on a national level, but there have been many outbreaks of distemper covered in the news media.
- Genetic studies of the canine distemper viruses in the U.S. may show strains that were
 previously undetected here, but it's almost impossible to determine if these strains are
 newly arrived or just newly detected because of improvements in testing. In addition,
 minor genetic changes often do not affect the antigenicity of the virus and have no
 impact on the efficacy of currently available vaccines.
- The currently available distemper vaccines are highly effective and will protect dogs
 against all currently circulating strains of canine distemper virus.
- The real issue is that there are unvaccinated (or inadequately vaccinated) and unprotected pets at high risk of developing a very deadly, yet preventable, disease.
- Dog owners are strongly urged to consult with their veterinarians regarding vaccination of their dog against distemper and other common diseases, including adenovirus, parvovirus and rabies.
